2016 Summer Fish Trip

MARK YOUR CALENDAR:

MSSA Annapolis summer fishing trip is scheduled for Wednesday July 20th from Rod and Reel Dock at Chesapeake Beach. The trip will be a live lining trip for Rock. It was made very clear to me last year that our group does not want to do summer trolling. I thought the timing schedule we used last year worked well. We left the dock at 10am and returned at 4pm. This will work fine if the rockfish and the spot co-operate. Last year the spot were in the Choptank River and the Rock were above the bay bridge. If we have this same fishing pattern this year we will have to make some changes to the trip. We can not go from Chesapeake Beach to the Choptank River and spot fish for several hours, then take an hour and a half or two hour ride to the fishing grounds above the bay bridge in a six hour (half day) trip. If we have this pattern we will need to do an 8 hour charter (full day) instead of a 6 hour (half day) charter. We will leave an hour earlier and come home an hour later. This would add \$20.00 a head to the cost.

If we have a traditional fishing pattern we will fish for spot in front of Chesapeake Beach, Holland Point or in the Choptank. Then go to Eastern Bay, the Gooses or False Channel and catch Rock. In the past we have had time, after we get our Rock, to chum blues or bottom fish for perch. Every year is different but this would be the norm. If you sign up for the trip you need to be flexible on timing and cost.

The price of the trip includes everything: tackle, bait, fish cleaning and tip for the mate. If you would like to bring a personal rod you may. You will need to bring your own food and drink in a small cooler to take on the boat, and a larger cooler to leave in your vehicle for fish. I also suggest sun screen and a hat. The cost of the trip for MSSA Annapolis members, wives, significant others, children and grandchildren is \$85.00. For non MSSA Annapolis members the cost is \$110.00. The difference is what the chapter supplements the trip for members. If we need to go to an 8 hour trip (full day charter) it will cost an extra \$20 each. We should know a few weeks in advance as to where Captain Randy, Drew and Dave will be fishing. We will be using the same 5 boats as last year, THE WORM, HOOKED UP 11, AND THE BAY HUNTER FLEET OF 3 BOATS. For now, e mail me with how many places you need, I will confirm your request. You need to send your check for either \$85.00 or \$110 (per person) to secure your place. We are starting off with 50 places. I will figure out how to collect the extra \$20.00 if it becomes an issue. **MAKE ALL CHECKS PAYABLE TO MSSA ANNAPOLIS CHAPTER**. DO NOT MAKE THEM PAYABLE TO ME. THE BANK WILL NOT LET ME ENDORSE THEM. I WILL HAVE TO SEND THEM BACK TO YOU.

It is VERY, VERY important to give me your cell phone number and your email address. Please take the extra time to write clearly. I'm not good at guessing numbers and letters. If you are late to the dock, if we need to cancel for any reason or if we need to extend the trip 2 hours at the last minute I will TRY to call, email or TX you.
